Methodology


On behalf of Unison, Yonder conducted an online survey among 512 respondents who had been further education (FE) students institutions in the last 12 months.

Percentages may not sum to 100% due to rounding.



In the past 12 months, which of the following statements have applied to you?






10% had a learning disability and had accessed SEN support –while 6% had a learning disability and had a EHC plan






Why did you need to attend the college/sixth form site while it was officially closed to most students?


Key benefits of online learning included saving time and money not having to travel and feeling safer about their / their families' health

What kind of benefits, if any, do you think online learning since the outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic brought you?




Feeling socially isolating, struggling to concentrate at home and ineffective online teaching were the main downsides of online learning
